Akhil Gramin Yuva Vikas Samiti (AGYVS) was founded as an NGO in the year 1975 by a group of dedicated and committed social activists, who were inspired by the ideologies of Mahatma Gandhi and Jaiprakash Narayan to work for the creation of a just and equal society. AGYVS is registered under the Society Registration Act, FCR Act, and Section 12(A) of the Income Tax Act. At present, AGYVS is operational in Muzaffarpur, Vaishali & East Champaran districts in Bihar.

## ♦ INFRASTRUCTURE

Women, Adolescent Girls, Children, Youth, Disabled and Farmers with an emphasis on poor and vulnerable sections of the society.

## HUMAN RESOURCES

AGYVS has a committed experienced team of 60 full-time staff that comprises professionals, health workers, animators, teachers, supervisors, etc. who work with sincerity and commitment for long for organization progress. AGYVS has a good team of volunteers also.

## <u>PROGRESS DURING THE YEAR</u>

## EDUCATION PROGRAM

(i) *Promotion of Basic Education*: Education is one of the important activities of AGYVS and it has been a major issue for the holistic development of society. Since its inception, AGYVS is making sincere efforts to spread primary education among children of child labours (boys and girls) as well as also promoting literacy to illiterate rural women by establishing educational centers called "Robert Bal Shramik Centre" and "Women Literacy Centre" at Kanti and Marwan blocks in Muzaffarpur district in Bihar. Since 1997, 02 "Robert Bal Shramik Centres" (For Children) and since 2013, 04 "Women Literacy Centers" (For Illiterate Women) were functional in 07 villages of the targeted blocks. These education centers are being run with the

financial support of Robert Af' Sandeberg, a devoted man for the educational development of poor children around the world. Details are as follows-

(ii) **National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS)**: Since 2009, AGYVS has been receiving support from the Ministry of Education (MOE), Government of India for the National School of Open Schooling by running a special center of NIOS (Centre Code 450115). The vital objects of NIOS are to provide education in the remote villages of India. It concentrates on the education of those students who lack opportunities for studies due to poverty. NIOS concentrates on primary and upper primary level education through alternate means of open schooling. Under NIOS, children are registered online to appear in the secondary examination. In 2018-

19, 60 poor and underprivileged children have been benefited from this unique initiative of AGYVS.



## VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMS

a. **PPI Project:** Rural women's limited access to productive resources, lower educational levels, and social norms about appropriate work for women tend to confine them to lower-

paid, lower-status works where opportunities for skills training and advancement are reduced, thus perpetuating their lower status. Widespread patterns of insecure employment and temporary and precarious contractual arrangements in many rural enterprises discourage employers from offering training to women.

Women do most of the work in the fields of rural Bihar but are consistently underpaid, which prevents them from achieving financial independence. Vocational training can empower these

women to uplift themselves out of financial dependence and decision-making power over their finances, livelihood, and life. In 2018-19, AGYVS with the financial support of People's for Progress in India, USA provided vocational training to 50 beneficiaries (25 girls and 25 boys) of the poor section of the society in readymade garments and diesel engine pump set repairing

trades. Beneficiaries from 5 Panchayats of Paru block in Muzaffarpur district were benefitted. The program has helped a lot in bringing sustainable changes in the socio-economic condition of the beneficiaries through employment/self-employment.

b. **BSDM Project:** Bihar Skill Development Mission (BSDM), Bihar has launched a unique skill

training program- "Kushal Yuva Program (KYP)" to enhance the employability skills of youth in the age group of 15-28 years (Age limit for SC/ST, OBC & People with Disabilities is as follows: SC/ST – 33 years, OBC – 31 years, PWD – 33 years), who have passed at least 10<sup>th</sup> Class irrespective of their having attained higher education or their currently pursuing higher education. Soft Skills training would comprise of Life skills, Communications Skills (English & Hindi),



and Basic computer literacy which in turn would enhance their employability. Through this program, BSDM intends to enhance the employability of these youth of Bihar.

## **AGYVS Contribution**

AGYVS is registered as SDC in this program since 1 June 2017 and so far imparted training to 580 youth and enhanced their employability successfully.

## E-SHAKTI PROJECT-NABARD

E-shakti or Digitization of SHGs is an initiative of Micro Credit and Innovations Department of <u>NABARD</u> in line with our Hon'ble PM statement, 'we move with the dream of electronic digital India...'. Digital India is a Rs 1.13-lakh crore initiative of the Government of India to integrate the government departments and the people of India and to ensure effective governance. It is to "transform India into a digitally empowered society and knowledge economy".

Keeping in view the Government of India's mission for creating a digital India, NABARD launched a project for the digitization of all Self Help Group (SHG) in the country. The project is being implemented in 100 districts across the country.

## **AGYVS Contribution**

AGYVS is digitizing the SHGs groups across the Muzaffarpur district in Bihar. In 2018-19., monthly data uploaded for 6,300 SHGs. The details are as follows:

## FPO PROJECT-NABARD

Indian Agriculture is predominantly characterized by a large number of dispersed and fragmented smallholdings. About 85% of the landholdings belong to small and marginal farmers. Being unorganized these farmers are unable to realize good value for their produces. Pilots implemented by NABARD and others indicate that the problems encountered by the small and marginal farmers can be mitigated to a large extent by organizing them into Farmers Producer Organization (FPO). FPO is one type of PO where the members are farmers. PO is a generic name of the organization of producers of any produce e.g. agricultural, non-farm products, artisan products, etc.

#### **AGYVS Contribution**

2 FPOs have been promoted by AGYVS under the NABARD project namely "Sarvodaya Vegetable Producers Company Limited" at village Anjanakot in Motipur block and "Litchi Farmers Producers Company Limited" at village Roopwara in Marwan block in Muzaffarpur district in Bihar. The details are as follows:

## NETWORKING PROGRAM FOR NGOS

In the present socio-economic scenario, it is not only important for the NGOs to work with commitment and dedication but also to possess a technical understanding of different aspects of the functioning of the NGO sector and the latest changes. It has been observed that in Bihar, most of the NGOs lack this capacity, and therefore not able to work efficiently as they should be.

To make efforts to minimize it, a network of NGOs called "Muzaffarpur Swaikchik Manch" is being promoted by AGYVS in the Muzaffarpur district. Presently, 14 committed and wellfunctioning NGOs are the members of this network who were periodically updated on topics like proposal writing, financial management, project implementation, office management, etc.

## PROMOTION OF FARMER'S CLUBS

Since 2009, AGYVS is taking initiative in this direction with the support of NABARD in Muzaffarpur district in Bihar. In 2018-19, 25 farmers' clubs were established in Kanti, Marwan,

and Motipur blocks comprising 15-20 small and marginal farmers in each club, Rs. 10,000/- is provided by NABARD for the efficient functioning of these groups. Monthly meetings of the groups were organized regularly to do savings, discuss the latest agriculture techniques and practices. Also imparted vocational training in agriculture-based trades like dairy, vegetable cultivation to promote greater value addition to their agriculture produces and forge new partnerships between public institutions and technology users.

l farmers

In 2018-19, Kisan Credit Cards were issued to the members of the 10 farmers' clubs based on their landholdings by the commercial bank, Muzaffarpur. It is now helping farmers to readily purchase agricultural inputs such as seeds, fertilizers, and pesticides and also withdraw cash for their production needs.

## CAMPAIGN AGAINST WOMEN VIOLENCE

Violence against women is partly a result of gender relations that assumes men to be superior to women. Given the subordinate status of women, much of gender violence is considered

normal and enjoys social sanction. To curb it, campaigns were launched in Kanti, Marwan, Paru, Sariya, Sahebganj, and Motipur blocks in Muzaffarpur district in Bihar in which following measures were adopted:

(i) Selection and training of Change Agents to organize women and aware and mobilize villagers in minimizing violence against women, information on Dowry Act, and providing legal assistance to women. 1,135 membership forms have been filled up.



(ii) Organization of 09 "Naya Dal" (Youth Wings- 308 members)" to pacify the work in the area and create a positive environment to bring desirable changes in this direction. These youth wings were instrumental to pressurize local administration to undertake appropriate steps to stop women's violence.

## OTHER PROGRAMS

• **Environment Awareness**: Awareness camps were periodically organized by AGYVS in different villages of Muzaffarpur, Vaishali, and East Champaran districts in Bihar to sensitize people on this important issue. In 2018-19, we successfully covered 5,000 population (men, women, youth, and children) making them aware of the importance of maintaining an environment for the survival of human beings. A good number of booklets and pamphlets were also distributed among the targeted population on this issue concerned.

◆ **<u>Cultural Programs</u>**: Cultural programs are an important tool to reach the common masses on any social issue in a positive manner. In 2018-19- street plays, puppet shows, and devotional songs were adopted by AGYVS as a means to spread awareness among the community on health and sanitation issues. Different villages of Muzaffarpur, Vaishali, and East Champaran districts in Bihar were covered under the program.
